I recently had the privilege of hosting Dr. Josh P. Kallimel of New Delhi, India in my home. Through the Discipleship Evangelism/Collection for the Saints ministry we were able to provide disci-

ple-ship material and benevolent help to his work. Josh is native full time missionary and church planter that has been working in the unreached parts of northern India since 1974. During these years there have been formed over 3000 pioneer churches in different states of northern India in spite of the difficult challenges and persecution.

Leadership Training to the Church Planters of India

As we have sown finances into Dr. Kallimel's work we are providing the necessary discipleship tools that his many church planters workers need. Since 1998, they have planted over 100 to 125 pioneer churches annually. Most of them have no other books to read other than their Bibles. Dr. Kallimel's goal is to now take the discipleship evangelism program and translate it into the Hindi language and print one to two thousand of these training books for his people.

Influencing the Leadership of India

Pastor Ravi of Bangalore, India wants to translate the 48 lesson D/E Program into Kannada and have his care cell leaders teach them to their care cell groups. There are more than 30 care cells and each one has between 20 and 25 members. This could influence 600 to 700 people (all leadership people) of this 3000 member church. Pastor Ravi's vision is that some of the people being trained in discipleship evangelism will go into the villages in areas where there are Hindu strongholds.
